**In our eight case exhibition, UBC museum anthropology students worked with Nuxalk Radio to support their mission:**

**Lhulhamktulhs ala ts'ktaliwalh alh ti s kulhulmcilh t'ayc n wa sulutilh ats (Broadcasting the Laws of the Lands and Waters).**

**Nuxalk Radio expresses the many voices of the Nuxalk Nation. Through the airwaves and online, the Radio connects the Nuxalk people to each other and to other Indigenous communities. It inspires Nuxalk language learning and promotes the return to ancestral governance. It fosters community well-being now and in the future for those not yet born and encourages Indigenous rights.**

**I see Nuxalk Radio as a grassroots start where we show in our community how everything fits together - language, history, culture. It is a very important piece for our community to be able to learn, share, and flourish as a people. I think that the more that our people listen, the more they will understand, and the more we can share with other communities. Radio is a powerful tool.**
